Key achievements to date until July 2021:	Areas for further improvement and baseline evidence of need:
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> As a result of improved teaching, the % of pupils attaining ARE improved in 2019-2020. 100% of pupils took part in the daily mile, which was coordinated by our Play Lead and re energised by incorporating a competitive element. 100% of pupils received coaching during lunchtimes from Active Fusion and Activ8. When reviewing support provided teachers reported improved confidence from 2018-19. We have retained our Active Travel Silver Award and School Games Gold Award. We significantly improved the percentage of Year 6 pupils meeting the end of key stage 2 swimming standards. The percentage of Year 5 pupils meeting the end of key stage 2 swimming standards is also high. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Due to COVID training for playground leaders was unable to be delivered. 2 teachers were unable to access CPD due to COVID. Fewer pupils took part in a narrower range of competitions compared to 2018-2019 due to the impact of COVID. Swimming for pupils in Year 4 was disrupted due to COVID and the percentage meeting the end of key stage 2 swimming standards has dipped for this cohort.
