

Religious observance

Children and staff are encouraged to celebrate festivals and religious observances are granted. Adaptations are made to mealtimes and some curriculum subjects for particular religious needs.

Food

All staff are aware of the religious requirements and the children they work with. We offer vegetarian alternatives when giving class treats and the lunch menu has been adapted to enable a range of requirements.

Languages and Parental Links

All members of the leadership team monitor the standards of teaching and provision for EAL pupils and a register of the children with EAL and their home language is kept in a central place on SharePoint.

The school accesses a local translation service to support staff in communicating with parents, if needed and the school's website can be translated into a range of languages so that parents can access the same information.

Curriculum

Diversity and Cultural inclusion is covered across the curriculum including:

We celebrate this though artwork, assemblies and whole school focus on festivals.
