Nursery have enjoyed reading the story of the 3 little pigs and produced some fantastic writing using their initial sounds for ppp-pig and hhh-house. They created some fabulous artwork during Art Festival week, printing a colourful pig using sponges and a stencil and then rollers for the houses. They also had a brilliant trip to Boston Park Farm and were a true credit to the school.

Reception have continued learning about growth and have planted a full and thriving garden full of vegetables. They used the Art Festival week to create their own natural collages using the items that they have grown on the farm. The children have continued to go from strength to strength during their phonics lessons, learning lots of new sounds. We think the Year 1 teachers will be very impressed with their progress in September.

Year 1 have continued to learn about animals in Science, global warming and what we can do to slow down the process. They've been exploring the technique of collage as part of the Art Festival week and have combined this technique with drawing to create a final piece. They have also been learning about capital cities as part of their Geography lessons. They enjoyed a brilliant day out at the Yorkshire Wildlife Park and have used their visit in their English lessons by writing up a recount of the day.

Year 2 have continued studying The Great Fire of London and the similarities and differences to life in Kenya. The children have spoke passionately to visitors about their learning who were impressed with their knowledge. As part of their reading and writing they have been reading Charlie Changes into a Chicken. The children have enjoyed this book and it has helped them produce a fantastic persuasive letter. To close out their time in Year 2 they have completed their Science learning with a trip to Austerfield. The excited children were well behaved and demonstrated their expert knowledge to the teachers there. Some of the children could have had a job teaching there over the summer! What expert habitat hunters and minibeast finders we have!

Year 3 rounded off their learning about Romans with a trip to Doncaster Museum which was a huge success. They got to dress up and complete some activities around life as a Roman. They produced some designs on sticks in their Art lessons and talked about how if they work alone they can break the sticks easily but if they work together they are harder to break! During Art Festival week they applied their new skills of scraffito and produced some really creative leaf pictures, thinking about primary colours.

Year 4 have been reading 'The Miraculous Journey of Edward Tulane' and the children have produced some fantastic pieces of writing including a news report, diary entry and a creative narrative. They have loved reading a book which has been unfamiliar to them and has opened their eyes to the importance of love and relationships and how these are the things which truly make us happy. They were also extremely lucky to be able to visit Magna on their school trip (despite the 40 degree heat!). The children were exceptional role models for our school and had a fantastic time exploring the science centre and taking part in the activities on offer.

Year 5 have enjoyed reading Street Child and George's Secret Key to the Universe, and their writing during their Beowulf topic was the best they've produced all year. Art week saw them producing some fabulous printing work that have been proudly on display in class. They all took part in the Social Justice Project, advocating for animal rights which they will continue to do in Year 6.

Year 6 have had an interesting term learning all about the Windrush Generation and understanding how richly diverse our country is due to their selflessness in coming to the UK in 1948 to help rebuild the UK after WWII. But of course, who can forget SATs week! The children absolutely smashed it! Some Year 6's had a truly amazing time at Kingswood where they got to experience new things as well as providing some much-needed peace and quiet for the parents!

Nursery: I am incredibly proud of how much the children have developed this year. Our highlights have to be our visit to the farm, the falconry owl visit, walks out to the wildlife area, the Friday baking sessions and our weekly yoga in the “big hall”! What a year we have had!
